About the Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club

The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club is an independent organization not affiliated with other boys and girls clubs, public or private institutions. Everybody plays at NBGC, whatever the skill or ability. Our program stresses teamwork, sportsmanship, responsibility, leadership training and conflict resolution. Since 1931, NBGC has offered our community a level of stability and experience not found in many other organizations. The program goes far beyond sports. Leadership skills, new friendships, and, most of all, a pride in oneself are the natural outcomes of the unique Neighborhood Boys and & Girls Club programs.

The Afterschool Program

The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club Afterschool Program model is to offer the best support to all families in the community. During the 2021-2022 school year, NBGC served approximately 430 youth in afterschool programs; NBGC Clubhouse location: 50 youth, Bateman School: 110 youth, Cleveland School: 30 youth, and Coonley School: 120 youth. A snack/meal, supervised homework assistance, structured recreational, physical and cultural activities are provided daily. When the pandemic hit and students were unable to return to school, NBGC provided an Assisted Remote Learning Program where students had the opportunity to participate in virtual classrooms and have a safe place as families returned to work. NBGC's commitment to developing leadership, strengthening our community and changing lives are what sets us apart from the other providers.

Principal Responsibilities of NBGC

- Daily supervision of youth afterschool at location by staff at a 25:1 ratio plus additional middle school, high school and college youth leaders as support. We cannot provide a 1:1 ratio.
- Serve snack or meal to program youth that is provided by school.
- Provide group homework help and individual help if program allows.
- Provide structured indoor and outdoor activities depending on space provided.
- Provide computer time in school lab.
- Provide transportation, walking or NBGC 15-passenger van, to the Clubhouse for athletic practices and games if youth or a sibling in the afterschool program are also registered in NBGC sports programming. Siblings travel together.
- Provide days off school supervision at Clubhouse for an additional cost - see Program Rates.

The NBGC Youth

NBGC has much to offer our youth. Many would say we are a one-stop shop. We do not have membership or annual registration fees. Families can participate one day or every day from Pre-K to College Graduate level.

The youth journey starts with our Cubbies program. Each spring, the 4-year-old Pre-K youth come to the NBGC Clubhouse on Saturday mornings for two hours to meet new friends, play games, receive basic sports instruction, make crafts and learn the NBGC Clubhouse structure. That child is now ready for the next adventure of summer camp!

As a rising kindergartener, they can attend summer camp a few days, a week or all 8 weeks from 8am-6pm depending on the family needs. In the K-1st Discovery Camp, they play outside, do crafts, learn sports, attend up to two field trips weekly and practice exemplary NBGC values of honesty, self-reliance, sportsmanship, teamwork, leadership and lasting friendships.

In the fall, the youth can join soccer, cheerleading, flag football, karate, improv, tennis and/or dance. Each day, at dismissal they join the NBGC afterschool program and stay at school doing homework and playing with friends, or they are taken to the NBGC Clubhouse for their team practice or game. In December, they join basketball. In February, they transition to floor hockey. In the spring, it is time for soccer, and summer is baseball, tennis and lacrosse time!

During days off school, Winter Break and Spring Break, the NBGC Clubhouse is open for fun and field trips while parents/guardians are busy working. If school closes for a snow day and the parent/guardian needs to go to work, the NBGC is open with fun activities. As summer comes around, the afterschool/athletic families that have participated in 3 consecutive sessions have priority summer camp registration before it opens to the public. Annually, the summer camp program is in high demand and historically has a waiting list.

This cycle of youth programming and support continues until the 4-year-old turns 13 and transitions into the Youth Leadership Program. They apply to be a Leader and enter a training program to build on their skills learned while being a member in the program. The Leader in Training (LIT) already knows the structure, the timing, who oversees each program, and where the equipment is kept, and now they learn how to engage, supervise and lead.

NBGC becomes their first employer and lays the foundation to help them develop a strong work ethic. The new Youth Leader is eligible to earn money for their service and are paid a sliding scale performance-based stipend deposited into a custodial bank account. As an 8th grader, they can begin earning scholarships for college. As they develop their leadership skills and take on more responsibilities, they can apply for part-time staff positions as athletic aides or out of school time aides. If they leave for college, they still have an opportunity to be awarded up to \$7,000 in scholarships annually if they meet the requirements and expectations. If they attend a local college and continue to work at the Clubhouse, they can have a flexible work schedule that puts their education first and are eligible for renewable scholarship funds until they graduate, upon meeting the requirements and expectations. It is not uncommon for a recipient to be awarded scholarships totaling up to \$50,000 and graduating debt-free.

NBGC Youth are responsible and caring citizens that positively give back to society.

The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club served more than 2400 youth in one or more of our programs between the 2021-2022 program year.



The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club Program Rates:

- **CPS Emergency Closing Days**

NBGC has a history of offering programming at the Clubhouse from 8am-6pm when CPS is closed. The NBGC families have come to rely on this support and can have an easy action plan if school closes for extreme cold, snow or teacher strikes. The cost for the families enrolled in the current Full afterschool session will be \$25 per youth per day to help cover the unexpected staffing charge.

- **Financial Assistance**

NBGC believes that “Everyone Plays” and offers families the following financial assistance:

- *Illinois Action for Children* - A state program that allows working and student parents the ability to apply for assistance based on income. The NBGC vouchers the state for youth childcare with a copay assigned to them by the state and paid to NBGC.
- *DCFS* – Families with children in the DCFS adoption and/or foster care program can apply for funds. The NBGC vouchers the state directly for services approved.
- *NBGC Financial Assistance* - All families in need can apply for financial assistance for our programs. Each family is unique and may need one time or ongoing assistance to thrive.
- *Payment Plans* – NBGC is always accommodating to families in need of making payments over time.

Afterschool Program Parent Guidelines

Welcome to the Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club. Please take the time to review the information and guidelines provided for you about our program. We want to provide your child with an exciting, fun-filled and safe experience. **Please discuss these policies with your child.** If you have any questions, please e-mail Bateman@nbgc.org for assistance.

License-Exempt Child Care Facility

Initials _____

The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club is a license-exempt facility as outlined in the Illinois Childcare Act of 1969, (225 ILCS 10/). NBGC is a program that serves only school-age children and is organized to promote childhood learning, child and youth development, educational and recreational activities, and character building. NBGC is not licensed or regulated by the Department of Children and Family Services but it does comply with the standards of the Illinois Department of Public Health, the Illinois State Fire Marshal and in accordance with the Illinois Department of Human Services.

Firearms

Initials _____

Notice to all members, parents, family and affiliates of the Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club. In compliance with Illinois state law 430ILCS 66/65: A licensee under this Act shall not knowingly carry a firearm on or into: Any building, real property, and parking area under the control of a pre-school or child care facility, including any room or portion of a building under the control of a pre-school or child care facility. We ask that all members, parents, family and affiliates adhere to the state law and in helping keep our youth and environment safe. Exception to this rule is if firearm is possessed by a peace officer.

Medical/Emergency Policies

Injury/Medical Emergency Procedures:

The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club will always try to provide a safe and healthy environment for your child/children. In the event of an emergency, the staff will follow the following procedures:

1. We will call 911 for medical professionals to handle any serious accidents.
2. A call will be made to you to inform you of the situation. If you cannot be reached, we will call the emergency number(s) you have given us on the Emergency Information Form.
3. Your signed medical release on the Youth Registration form authorizes medical treatment as needed.
4. If your child needs to go to the emergency room, a staff member will accompany him/her/them in the ambulance to the nearest hospital and will remain with him/her/them until a parent or guardian arrives.

Medication

Initials _____

The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club does not administer medication of any kind. Therefore, staff should not be asked to administer shots or oral medication. If a child is required by a doctor to take medication, the medication should be administered at home. If any medication is required during NBGC activities, a parent or guardian of the child may 1) *bring the medication, (oral or injection, in the original container with the child's name on it) to NBGC for the child to administer to himself or herself under the supervision of the Senior Staff (all medication will be kept in the Senior Staff Office) or 2) accompany or join the child at the program in order to administer the medication.* The exception to this policy is if the parent provides a Physician certified medical action plan that the organization can accommodate.

NBGC Participant Rules & Expectations

- Be kind & respectful to everyone, equipment and the environment.
- Listen well.
- Always include others.
- Have FUN!
- Children must participate with their group throughout the day.
- Put away electronics during program hours unless needed for schoolwork.

Discipline

Initials _____

Discipline will be administered for one or more of the following:

- A child may not disturb or hurt others, verbally or physically.
- A child may not damage equipment or property.
- A child may not place himself/herself in a dangerous situation.

A child's misconduct will be handled as follows:

1. *First Occurrence:* Persistent misbehavior will be discussed with the parent or a written notice will be forwarded to the parent(s) to request a meeting with them to discuss the matter. Parental failure to respond will result in your child being terminated from the NBGC Afterschool Program.
2. *Second Occurrence:* If a second written notice or meeting is needed due to continual misconduct by the child, it will result in an immediate 3-5 day suspension from NBGC without a refund to the parents.
3. *Third Occurrence:* Your child will be dropped from the NBGC Afterschool Program when the third notice of inappropriate behavior is documented without a refund to the parents.

The exception to the above process will be if a child becomes physically or verbally abusive to a staff member or puts themselves or someone else in immediate danger. The child's parent(s) will be called immediately, and the child will be terminated from the NBGC Afterschool Program.

Consequences for misbehavior may include restrictions from the program and/or trips without a refund to the parents.



Supervision

Authorized Pick-Up People

Initials _____

Only those persons authorized in writing on the Emergency Information Sheet may pick up a child. We will not release any child to an unauthorized person for any reason. If you plan to have your child picked up by someone other than an authorized person, it is necessary to notify a Senior Staff Member. **If someone is prohibited from picking up your child, their name must be documented on the registration form. If a court order is applicable, a copy should be provided.**

Sign-out Policy

When you pick up your child, you must enter the building, sign the attendance sheet and write down the correct time. You will be asked to show a picture I.D. This is to ensure the safety of your child.

Late Pick Up Fee

All programming ends at 6:00 pm. All Children must be signed out by this time. A \$1.00 per each minute late fee per child will be assessed. Calling us to notify us of tardiness does not void the late pickup charge.

Attire

Initials _____

During the program, your child should wear comfortable clothing and shoes. Remember, your child will be involved in a sports and recreational program and should dress accordingly. **All valuables should be left at home. We cannot be responsible for, or replace any item lost or taken.** All items that your child will be bringing should be labeled clearly with the child's full name.

Walk/Drive Programs

Initials _____

The NBGC staff may walk youth to the Clubhouse as part of the program on a daily basis or if the youth are participating in an athletic program. Safety is very important, and youth must be aware and follow walking and passenger rules at all times. If a youth is not following safety rules, they may be suspended from the walking program or removed from the walking program for the remainder of the session/year. We always want to give second chances to individuals, but group safety can never be placed at risk. If a child is removed from the walking program, the responsibility for transportation will be on the family. Refunds will not be issued if the child is removed from the walking program. We may use the NBGC 15 passenger van as transportation if available when needed.

Field Trips for Spring Break and Winter Break

Initials _____

Included in the Emergency Information Sheet is a field trip permission slip. This signed release allows the Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club to include your child in field trips planned for your child's learning and enjoyment purposes. These field trips include, but are not limited to, paid trips where a bus may be used, paid trips in the neighborhood requiring the children to walk, walking trips to other parks and/or activities, free trips. If your child does not wish to attend a field trip, the parent(s) must send a note prior to leaving on the trip. If your child does not attend the trip, we will try to provide alternative activities for their enjoyment or ask that you make other arrangements for the day. All trips must leave the Clubhouse on time. Children that are late and arrive after the bus has left will be offered the following options: (1) Depending on the field trip, parents might be allowed to drive them to the trip and hand them off to the staff. This must be approved by the Program Director. I understand that my child must wear an NBGC Camp Shirt for all trips and if they do not have a shirt I will be charged \$15.00 for a shirt.

Lunch for Days Off School, Spring Break and Winter Break

I understand that I must provide a lunch (or money to purchase a lunch, if available) for my child each day. If I do not provide a lunch, then I understand that I will be charged a \$5.00-\$10.00 lunch fee and my child will be provided with a lunch.

Contracted Services

Initials _____

When a child is registered for the NBGC Afterschool Programs, please realize that plans are already set in motion to ensure that your child receives the best program care. We understand that plans change, and we have policies to handle these requests. After registration, the families will be invoiced at the beginning of each session. If you are not planning on using the program you must notify NBGC in writing two weeks prior to the start of the next session that you will not be using. **All notifications of cancellation MUST be made in writing to finance@nbgc.org. Refunds will not be issued after the start of a session.** Full registration forms and first session payment are due one week prior to initial start of program each school year. All additional sessions will be automatically invoiced.

Days off School not included

Initials _____

All full CPS days off school are not included in the full sessions of the afterschool program. Families can purchase the days off package for all CPS days off or pay for these days individually as needed. This does not include Winter Break or Spring Break which are purchased separately. Package pricing is heavily discounted and will not be prorated.

Requests for Refunds for Prepaid Services
